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## MASONIC FOUNDATION UPDATE

*V.W. Bro. Angus Stewart (#166), District Rep.*



Barb Spencer, the CEO of the Zebra Child Protection Centre, was the guest speaker at our quarterly meeting in November. They have dealt with over 1000 children, most of them less than 14 years of age, which have been physically or sexually abused. Zebra's multi-disciplined team consists of 18 police officers, 8 social workers, 10 crown prosecutors, and over 60 community volunteers. The police officers have expertise in interviewing children and listening to their stories. These interviews are taped and allowed as testimony in court.

Zebra Child Protection Centre has been in operation for 9 years. Originally there was no support system in place for victims. The conviction rate was only around 20%. Without a support system, many of the children and youth turned to a high risk lifestyle and drug use. Today, when charges of abuse are laid after an investigation, 89% of those charged plead guilty.

Courtrooms are more child-friendly today than they used to be. Usually a child is not required to appear in court. If they do, they can be placed in a "grotto" or screened area where they can see only the judge and will not have to face their perpetrator directly. The child can be seen on the screen of a monitor in the courtroom.

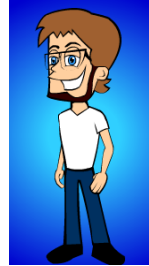

## LONG HAired JOHN

Brethren, I offer you this story for your Masonic Education. It contains a powerful message and tells us who we are... or should be.

His name is John, he has wild hair, wears a T-shirt with holes in it, jeans and no shoes. This was literally his wardrobe for his entire four years of college. He was the top of this class. Kind of esoteric and very, very bright. He became a Mason recently while attending college. After moving to his new town, he finds that down the street from his new apartment is a well-dressed, very conservative Lodge. One day John decides to go there after work. He walks in with shoes, jeans, his work shirt, and long hair.

The lodge has already started and so John starts looking for a seat. The lodge is completely packed and he can't find a seat. By now the Brethren are really looking a bit uncomfortable, but no one says anything. John gets closer and closer to the East and, when he realizes there are no seats, he squats down right on the carpet. (Although perfectly acceptable behavior at a college fellowship, trust me, this had never happened in this Lodge before!) By now the Brethren are really uptight, and the tension in the air is thick. About this time, the Secretary realizes that from way at the back of the Lodge, a Past Master is slowly making his way toward John.

Now the Past Master is in his eighties, has silver-gray hair, and a three-piece suit. A good man, very elegant, very dignified, and very courtly. He walks with a cane and, as he starts walking toward this boy, everyone is saying to themselves that you can't blame him for what he's going to do. How can you expect a man of his age and of his background to understand some college kid in the Lodge? It takes a long time for the man to reach the boy. The Lodge is utterly silent except for the clicking of the man's cane.

All eyes are focused on him. You can't even hear anyone breathing. The Secretary can't even continue with the "Minutes" until the Past Master does what he has to do. And now the Lodge watches as this elderly man drops his cane on the floor. With great difficulty, he lowers himself and sits down next to John and welcomes him so he won't be alone.

When the Secretary gains control, he says "What I'm about to say, you will never remember. What you have seen, you will never forget. Be careful how you live. You may be the only Mason some people will ever meet."

From the Old Tyler's Talks

What do you think happened to me in there tonight?" asked the New Brother of the Old Tyler.

"Someone give you a dollar?" asked the Old Tyler. "No, of course not!"

"You give someone a dollar?" "Certainly not!"

"Well, I can't imagine what happened. Men don't usually get as excited as you are except about getting or giving dollars. What did happen?"

"Brother Smith asked me if I would stand for selection as Junior Steward in December!"

"Most natural and reprehensible of Brother Smith!" chuckled the Old Tyler. "Of course you told him you would be pleased to do so."

"Why was it natural and why was it reprehensible, and of course I did nothing of the sort!" answered the New Brother.

"It is natural for men to ask their friends if they want office. It is reprehensible, because Masonry in lodge practice is not supposed to have any politics. A selection is supposed to be like a wen, something that just grows without any previous warning or conversation! But why didn't you accept with pleasure?"

"I didn't accept at all! What would I want to be an officer for?" "Why not?"

"Why, Old Tyler, you know well enough why not! I have heard you talk before about the responsibilities of office. An officer has to serve at least seven years before he gets to the East in this lodge. He has to learn degrees and attend meetings and go to all funerals and visit the sick and labor instructing candidates and I don't know what all besides. Why should I run my head into any such noose as that? What does the officer get out of it, anyway? Nothing but fifty dollars' worth of squares and compasses to hang on a blue ribbon on his coat and for the rest of his life have some Master say, 'You are cordially invited to a seat in the East!' Not for me, thank you!"

"No, very evidently not for you," agreed the Old Tyler.

"Did you tell Brother Smith all this?" "I sure did!"

"What did he say?" "He didn't say anything. He just looked shocked!"

"I can understand that," mused the Old Tyler, placidly.

"Most men are shocked when they go to a friend to do him honour and make him the priceless gift, and he laughs in their faces and calls their gift trash."

"Say, hold on a minute! What are you talking about? He didn't try to give me anything. He tried to wish something on me. He tried . . .

"Oh, no, he didn't!" contradicted the Old Tyler. "You are laboring under a misapprehension. You evidently think a lodge has to beg members to be her servants. Such is not the case. The lodge looks around to see which of her sons she will honour. Through a few men she picked on you. Brother Smith came to you with the Gift of the Magi in his hands. Of course, the gift is not his to make, it is the lodge's to make. But just because there is, now and then, the unappreciative, non-understanding member, who would tread on pearls if they were thrown before him, to get at the swill of ease and luxury instead of the jewels of labor and their reward, the lodge allows certain of its brethren to sound out the others before it offers them the position by selection.

"The lodge looks upon the selection to the junior end of the line as a signal honour. In all probability, the man elected Junior Steward this year will be the Master seven years hence. At least he can be, if he has ability and love for Masonry and sticks to his job. So the lodge feels that in saying to a brother 'you may be a Master in seven years; at least, we will trust you to try, as we will try you in trust,' it is paying him the greatest compliment outside of an actual election to the East which it can pay. As betrothal is to marriage, so is selection to the foot of the line to the Mastership.

"To be Master of a lodge is a position of responsibility. It means work. It means effort. It means trials. It means difficulty. But it also means much in education, in assurance on one's feet, in knowledge of character and strength of will and wit. Being Master brings great rewards, of which your 'fifty dollars' worth of gold' is but the symbol, not the substance.

"But we all make mistakes, and Brother Smith and I both made one. When he asked me about you, I said you had good stuff in you. So he spoke to you, but you don't want to bring it out for the lodge. That's your business. It was our error. So we will take the better man."

"Why . . . Why didn't you take the better man in the first place?" asked the New Brother.

"Oh, we didn't know he was the better man until you told us so. You had concealed it from us. We thought you had Master's quality in you. Willingness to serve, love of your fellows, desire to be something in Masonry for what it will do for you and what you can do for others; these make a Master's quality. But we were mistaken."

"No, I was mistaken," cried the New Brother remorsefully. "Do you suppose I could unconvince Brother Smith?"

"Not this year," answered the Old Tyler. "You have a year to try."

**IVANHEE THE BEGINING***W. Bro. David Wright (#142)**From History of the Grand Lodge of Alberta 1905-1980*

"too many Masons, had for some reason become lethargic. Particular stress was laid on the fact that far too many were apparently content to pay dues yearly to Lodges without the Jurisdiction in which they were not and in many cases had been resident without any active participation in the Masonic life of their community." With determination to

correct this situation the name Ivanhoe was chosen and Patricia Lodge agreed to let Ivanhoe #142 use its Lodge room. April 2, 1925 it was instituted and constituted July 8, 1926. In 1933 the Lodge received a set of gavels made from the roof beams of the 600 year old church of St. Botolphs in Borton, Lincolnshire, England. According to a story of Sir Walter Scott, Ivanhoe, a Saxon Knight, recovered from wounds in the Priory of St. Botolphs. The gavels were presented by M.W.Bro. John Martland who designed them. They were made by Bro. J. Francis of Edmonton Lodge #7 and W.Bro. Plowman of Jasper Lodge #14. These early incidents indicate the enthusiasm and strength of Ivanhoe Lodge which has continued in its early tradition of dedication and originality. An example is when the Lodge erected a cairn to mark the first Masonic Lodge meeting north of the Arctic Circle in Canada held August 30, 1938. To commemorate this historic event the Lodge decided to place a pillar of granite - carved in Edmonton - on the site. It was dedicated in a special ceremony in 1940 at Coppermine.
